

## Registration:

- Registration will open to Faculty, Staff and Students on **Thursday, Feb 4, 2010** from 10:00am-3:00pm at the Frist Campus Center.
- Registration for the general public will begin on **Monday, March 15, 2010** from 9:00am-4:30pm in Dillon Gym, Room 103.
- We only accept cash and checks. Please make all checks payable to Princeton University.

## Payments:

- At the time of registration, **\$100/week** registered is due.
- Final payment for all weeks of camp are due by **Friday, May 28, 2010** at 4:30pm. Any payment not received by this date will incur a \$100.00 late fee.
- If after **Friday, June 4, 2010** at 4:30pm, there are any outstanding fees not paid, the camper will be dropped from the camp, the entire deposit will be lost, and spaces will be offered to names on the waiting list. At this time campers will have to re-register and pay the full amount for weeks they are requesting if space is still available.

## Cancellation and Refund Policy:

- After **Friday, May 7, 2010** at 4:30pm, switching or cancelling any weeks will incur a \$100.00 change fee. Withdrawal of entire applications are subject to the loss of the entire deposit after this date.
- Refunds will not be given for absences.
- Please be aware that we are not affiliated with any other Princeton University camp, therefore, our refund and cancellation policies are specifically enforced for the Campus Recreation Summer Day Camp programs only.

## Summer Day Camp for Children Ages 6-13



The Princeton University Summer Day Camp is split up into two separate camps. The camper's day will be filled with a variety of sports, games, arts and crafts, and camp activities that are designed to keep your camper active and engaged throughout the week. Each camp provides programs and trips that are designed for their specific age group. Themed weeks add to the creativity and enjoyment of each session. All campers must be 6 years of age at the start of camp, Monday June 21, 2010. We regret that there are **NO** exceptions to this rule.

### Camp Hours:

Camp drop off each day is between 8:00am-9:00am and camp pick up is between 4:00pm-4:45pm. We offer Post-Camp Care from 4:45pm-5:15pm after the official camp day ends. This is available for an additional \$25.00 per week.

### Field Trips/Special Events:

Field Trips and Special Events will be posted on our website.

### Junior Camp - ages 6-10 years old

The Junior Campers will receive swim lessons every morning from our certified Water Safety Instructors and a free swim period every afternoon. The campers are divided into 3 groups by age: 6's, 7 & 8's, and 9 & 10's. Wednesdays are when the Field Trips are scheduled, where your camper will travel by bus to an off-site location.

### Senior Camp - ages 11-13 years old

The Senior Campers will have a free swim period every afternoon. Every Tuesday your camper will be going to Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park in Long Branch for a beach trip, which will include surf lessons on alternating weeks. On Thursdays, your camper will enjoy an additional field trip where they will travel by bus to an off-site location.

### Lunch and Snacks:

Please make sure your camper brings a lunch and beverage to camp. Please do not send money to buy a beverage on campus, as we cannot escort the campers to stores or vending machines. Friday is FREE LUNCH PIZZA and ICE CREAM!! Therefore, a bag lunch will not be needed on those days, unless your camper does not eat pizza. The camp will provide snacks each afternoon on a daily basis. If your camper has special dietary needs, please note this on your application forms.

### Summer Camp Staff:

Our head counselors will be coordinating the Summer Day Camp program. They are all full-time teachers during the year, and will be responsible for the direct oversight of the campers and camp counselor staff. All of our general counselors are ages 18 and over, have been trained in CPR/First Aid, and will make sure your camper has an enjoyable experience with us.

### Camp Dress:

All campers will receive a t-shirt and bag for attending. The t-shirt must be worn on days when the camp is attending their Field Trip off-site. Campers will need to bring bathing suits and towels each day. We also recommend you provide sunscreen on days when the camp is traveling. Please make sure your camper has sneakers and appropriate footwear for camp activities. NO CROCS or SANDALS will be permitted to be worn during most of the day.

## Counselor In Training (CIT) Program, Ages 14-17

Too old to be a camper, but not old enough to be a counselor? Learn the basics of camp counseling while having fun. Get a head start on developing important job skills during an active week of learning games and leadership skills. For one week, CIT's will assist counselors with younger children during camp activities and on field trips. CIT participants will receive a CIT staff shirt that must be worn everyday at camp.

Individuals must complete an application and interview process before being considered for the program. Participants will be required to attend a CIT training program on June 14, 2010 from 6:30pm-8:30pm.
