

# Recycling on Campus

Recycling helps the environment and is the law in New Jersey. Help Princeton University reduce waste by recycling properly.

## Paper/Cardboard Bins:

- All white or colored paper
- All envelopes
- Mail/newspaper/flyers
- Magazines, books
- Cardboard and paperboard

## Not Recyclable (Trash):

- Food contaminated items
- Pizza boxes, plates, napkins, tissues
- Plastic or paper cups, yogurt containers
- Waxed or glossy paper containers
- Any plastic, glass or metal that is not a bottle or jar
- Styrofoam

## Cans/Bottles Bins:

- All bottles and jars: glass or plastic (#1–#7), emptied and rinsed well
- All metal cans

## Other Recycling: *(see website)*

- Batteries, plastic bags, electronics, lightbulbs, ink and toner cartridges, hazardous materials

### *Reduce, Reuse, Recycle*

Recycling is much better for the environment than trash, but it still uses energy. Buy products with less packaging and reuse items whenever possible rather than buying something new.
