



What to Expect at the SHARE office

- 1-SHARE services are confidential (limits of confidentiality are explained, e.g., imminent risk)
- 2-Survivor is asked to tell as much or as little about what happened, enough to give SHARE Director a sense of what occurred so options can be offered.
- 3-SHARE's purpose is to offer options, counseling and advocacy services. All decisions are made by person consulting with SHARE office.
- 4-SHARE offers accompaniment to on and off-campus options (medical, deans, residential colleges, Ombudsman, police, hospital, court)
- 5-Options available will depend on timeframe. Some options such as forensic evidence collection are time sensitive (up to 5 days after sexual assault)

What to Expect At:

COLLEGES

- Inform student that academic and housing support is available through their Directors of Student Life and College Deans.

Department of Public Safety (DPS)

- DPS is available to make an on-campus report.
- Reporting to DPS may trigger a criminal report with external law enforcement.
- Reporting to DPS will trigger a referral for review by ODUS.
- Informs survivors that a non-Princeton University community member can be made *persona non grata*

Graduate School (GS)

- The Graduate School is the option for on-campus formal reporting and adjudication.
- GS is a non-confidential resource, so if a report is made to GS, this obligates the University to follow-up in some manner.
- A survivor can meet with GS to learn more about adjudication process without making a formal report as long as s/he does not disclose identifying information.
- Survivor can request a No Contact Order from the GS.
- GS maintains neutrality in all interactions and processes with all parties involved.
- Serves as a liaison and facilitator for academic and/or housing accommodations.

Human Resources/Dean of Faculty

- A non-Princeton University community member can be made *persona non grata*
- HR can serve as support and resource on information
- HR or the Dean of Faculty office serve as places to report for faculty and staff
- Carebridge counseling services are available.



Office of the Dean Undergraduate Students (ODUS)

- ODUS is the option for on-campus formal reporting and adjudication for violations committed by undergraduate students.
- ODUS is a non-confidential resource; therefore if a report is made to ODUS, this obligates the University to follow-up in some manner.
- A survivor can meet with ODUS to learn more about adjudication process without making a formal report if identifying information is not disclosed.
- Undergraduate Students can request a No Contact Order from ODUS.
- ODUS maintains neutrality in all interactions and processes with all parties involved.
- Serves as a liaison and facilitator for academic and/or housing accommodations.

OMBUDS

- A confidential, informal resolution option available on-campus available through the Ombudsman office. The office provides mediation, structured dialogues, shuttle diplomacy and consultations.
- Mediation is neutral, voluntary and unenforceable.

University Health Services (UHS)

- Emergency contraceptive and/or prophylactic STI treatment through UHS. Additionally, survivor is offered Inpatient Unit as needed.
- Counseling & Psychological Services and Medical Services are available.

WomanSpace

- Advocacy and counseling are available
- 24-hour hotline
- Shelters and transitional housing available in cases of interpersonal violence
- Services are confidential.

Borough/Township Police Department

- Filing a criminal report is possible through relevant agency
- Be informed that not every report and/or arrest will result in prosecution
- These off-campus police departments can issue temporary restraining order in cases of interpersonal dating violence or stalking.

Criminal or Civil Court

- Can issue temporary and permanent restraining order in cases of interpersonal dating violence or stalking
