Prerequisite:

- Sociology students planning on applying for a GNI fellowship must complete Sociology 514 or WWS 594f in order to insure that they have the necessary scholarly background to profit from the GNI placement.
- Students in Economics, Politics and Psychology can also enroll in WWS 594f in the Spring term of 2008. But they may also detail the coursework they have done that has given them appropriate academic background in the study of inequality.
- The selection committee will entertain exceptions from students who are in the third year or beyond in 2008-09. Students in these classes who have not taken either of these courses should take care to explain how their academic background has prepared them for this placement.
