Faculty Resolutions: Discipline Committee Procedures, 1969

Attached is a resolution to be presented at the Special Meeting of the Faculty called for Monday, March 17, at 4:00 p. m. , in 10 McCosh. This resolution deals with questions concerning procedures of the Committee on Discipline which must be resolved without delay. To insure that Hearings commence promptly, we shall ask the Faculty to suspend its rules so that this matter can be considered at the Special Meeting.

Resolution regarding procedures of the

The Faculty resolves that the following shall become part of the established procedures governing the Committee on Discipline:

1. Any student who has been charged with violating University rules and whose case is to be heard by the Committee on Discipline shall have the right to request that the Chairman of the Committee make appropriate arrangements, as defined below, to make public the Hearings on the student's case.

2. Appropriate arrangements are defined as follows: (1) allowing for the presence of spectators at Committee Hearings under the conditions required for fair, orderly, and dignified proceedings; and (2) in exceptional cases, the broadcasting of the Hearings over campus radio. Committee members, defendants, and witnesses may speak in accordance with the present rules and procedures of the Committee. Spectators in the room are to be present as observers only.

3. The Chairman of the Committee on Discipline shall be responsible for the orderly conduct of the meeting, and he shall have the obligation to take whatever actions are necessary to insure this including, if the need arises, requiring spectators to leave. In view of the importance of the proper conduct of the Hearings to the individuals directly concerned and to the entire University community, any interference with fair, orderly, and dignified proceedings shall be regarded as a grave violation of University regulations.

4. The deliberations of the Committee, after testimony has been heard, will be conducted in private, as they have been in the past.
