Table A-1 summarizes the number and tonnage by flag of registry of all tankers in the world fleet. This data? extracted from Lloyd's Statistical Tables, is the most current and comprehensive available. It includes all ships as of ,July 1, 1974 which are larger than a small base size of 100 gross tons.

Table .4-2, from the same source? summarizes the size, and age distribution of this same number of ships.

Table A-3 uses the same data base and summarizes the world supertanker fleet both in service and under construction in 1974. Table A4 lists the number of supertankers registered in the major maritime countries of the world and Table A-5 summarizes the trade routes of the world fleet.
