Steinberg has written on 20th-century Germany, Italy, Austria, and Switzerland and also prepared the official report on Deutsche Bank’s gold transactions in the World War II that appeared in 1999. In 2003, he completed *European History and European Lives, 1715 to 1914*, a 36-part series of biographies produced by The Teaching Company. His teaching covers modern Europe since 1789 with specialization in the German and Austrian Empires, Nazi Germany, Fascist Italy, and modern Jewish history. Ph.D. Cambridge University.
