Exploring Change in Mongolia: Return to the Darhad

Bob Peck ’74 an historian, writer, and photographer has explored remote places across the globe. Bob has traveled extensively in Mongolia and will present a screening of a documentary film entitled: Return to the Darhad: Exploring Change in Mongolia. The film chronicles Peck's return to northern Mongolia to find and photograph a group of nomadic families whose lives he first recorded with a ground-breaking series of black-and-white photographs in 1994 and 1995. Peck's journey takes us to Naadam, an ancient Mongolian competition involving riding, archery and wrestling, and into the changing lives of Mongolia's nomadic herders. Interweaving current footage with Peck's stunning black-and-white still images of the past, the film reflects on culture, tradition, the inevitability of change, discovery, loss, and the passing of time. Don't miss this chance to experience life on the steppes of Central Asia in this remarkable film. A discussion on the film and on Mongolia will follow.
