So who is that snazzy man to the right of this blurb?

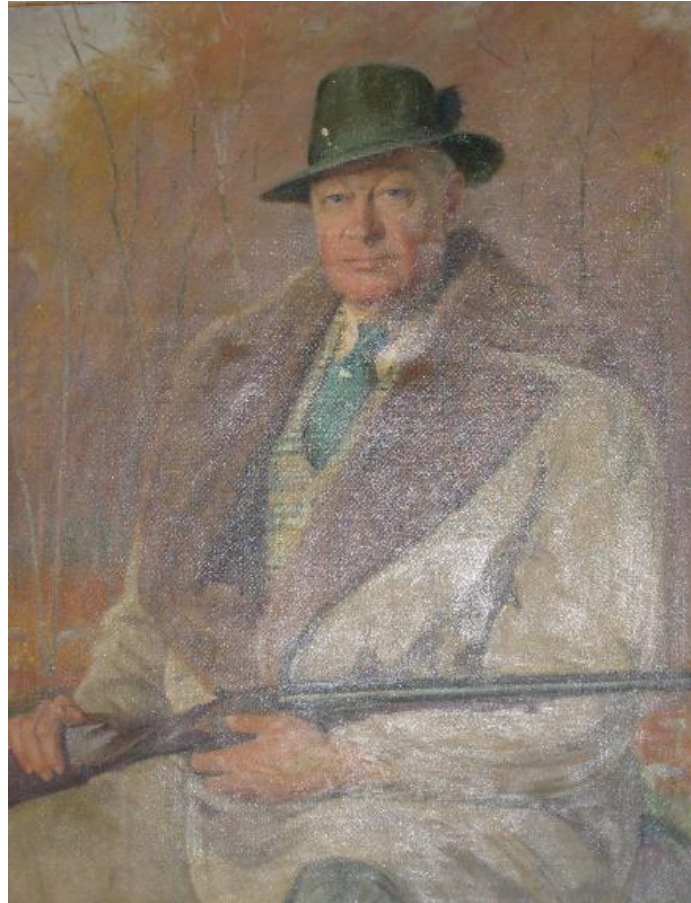
Why, that's Mr. T. Ferdinand Wilcox '00 (old school '00--1900).
