A chance to create your own pot of gold

Do you know what May 10th is? Yes, it's the Sunday before Dean's Date and you'll probably be madly scrambling to finish your papers, but we urge you not to forget that it's also Mother's Day! Want to give her something special and unique? Head on down to the Wilson Ceramics Studio!

"The Wilson Ceramics Studio is primarily student-run and caters to undergraduate students, graduate students, and faculty. The studio has space for both wheelthrowing and handbuilding, and the studio managers are available to teach both methods in both styles of ceramics. We have an assortment of colored slips and glazes for coloring pieces, and we do both bisque-

and glaze-firings in-house," says Andrew Sue-Ako, one of the studio managers.

Andrew, along with Heather Landry, the other studio manager, are in charge of the approximately decade-old studio, now in its second incarnation. In the past two years, the studio has expanded to being open for 13 hours during the week versus only two in the past.

"In addition to more hours, we bought a new, high-class wheel and mixed many more glazes than the studio previously had. We intend to eventually improve the utilization of space, since we can't very well build more to the studio, since it's in the basement of 1938, and upgrade the ventila-

tion system," explains Andrew.

Along with the new glazes, the Ceramics Studio contains high-quality, well-maintained equipment. "The new wheel that I mentioned earlier is produced by Soldner (thusly called a "Soldner wheel"), and it boasts a very smooth operation and bidirectional control, which is something only the kick wheels could do before," Andrew says.

Excited and intrigued by the possibility of creating something that your mom can display with real pride, but scared you'll create something that only your mother will love? Let the studio managers help. "Studio managers are available to help students through a project from start to finish," supplies Andrew.

But don't forget about your masterpiece! "The problem we usually have to deal with is that ceramic projects take at least a week to complete (and usually takes more time based on the firing schedule) and so most people don't end up finishing their pieces since they just kind of forget about it. Please remember to glaze your unfinished works!" urges Andrew.

If you've got a piece to finish or a pot to start, head on over to the studio. You still have time to create that perfect gift for Mother's Day!
